2024 REVIEW

Wow what a year. Yesterday it seems we were looking at what to set for goals in 2024. Looking back, they were aggressive. Now it's time to see how we did in 2024. A self-evaluation for Natural Right Firearms.

We started the company focusing more on training especially enhanced carry and responsibly armed concealed carry citizens. Once we built the range our focus became more on advancing the shooting sport. We chose to host primarily USPSA and steel challenge events. It is a reputable organization with tried and proven ruleset which focuses on safety and sportsmanship.

We built the range with that in mind. We wanted to host one USPSA match and one Steel Challenge match each month and do that proficiently before we moved to do other type matches. I think we did well to achieve that goal. We hosted 24 matches in 2024. 13 USPSA/Hit Factor matches, and 11 Steel Challenge matches one of which was our first Tier II State Championship.

2025 / January Issue

2024

In 2024 we set a goal to expand the range so we could do two things. We wanted to have enough bays so we could host Tier II and level 2 matches. And we wanted to be able to leave steel challenge bays set so range members could come practice any time they like and still have plenty of bays to host USPSA matches without needing to tear the SC bays down. We accomplished that and more. My neighbor who is the best farmer in MS is also the best at designing for proper drainage. We were able to expand the range to 10 bays while having one of the best drained ranges around. In fact, looking back over the year we didn't have to cancel any matches because the range was too wet. It did get sloppy a couple times on the new bays, but we were able to put on the show.

As I noted on the side panel, we hosted our first Tier II State Steel Challenge match this year. Boy was that a chore. It was a success. Our goal was to get our feet wet running a higher-level match. Obviously, we had some kinks and people who have put on these before knowing that you are never going to hit a home run the first at bat. We have a baseline now and all the professional Range Masters out there should know we are only going to get better. Our goal is to make our matches the best we can for the shooter, and we learn every time we host a new match.

In addition to the 4 new bays, we have added a flagpole, which doesn't improve the shooting. Though, along with my faith it advertises our commitment to be

patriots of this great country. We want to take every advantage we can to thank our law enforcement, military, and first responders for their sacrifices. Also, we want to give the greatest honor to our Lord who sacrificed everything so that we could be redeemed. Another addition which is going to be nice is we now have power and WIFI on the range. Hosting matches going forward should be much smoother.



2025

We plan to hit the ground running in 2025. We already have big plans for the first quarter of the year. Starting January 4, we will have our first Steel Challenge match a level 1 running the fast 6 stages. Just to get the rust knocked off. Then on January 18th our first run-n-gun. We are dedicated to run 12 USPSA matches in 2025. We are tentatively planning to run a 10 stage one day level 1 match on September 20th. This could turn into something bigger. Wouldn't it be good to see several national ranked shooters coming to the Pine Belt Run-N-Gun Sponsored by Masterpiece Arms?

Also in January, on the weekend of the 25-26 NRF Range is hosting an RO seminar. A key component of USPSA and Steel Challenge is having trained range officers to officiate the matches and make sure they run smoothly. Most of the time at the local level these are volunteer positions but vital to ensure the matches are safe and fair for all competitors. In April we will run our normal Steel Challenge and USPSA matches the first and third Saturday however in May the Steel Challenge will be routine, but May 17th I will be running a 6 Stage USPSA Classifier match. So, if you need a classification in a specific class, you can get that at one match.

TRAINING

As far as training goes, I am finding less time for enhanced carry classes than ever. I still love to do them but organizing classes is just not worth the effort. There are so many reputable instructors out there that can do them. Marlin Huddleston with Integricorp LLC uses the same curriculum as I and his primary focus is on firearm instruction. He uses our range for his live fire exercises and would love to teach you enhanced carry. Also, you may check out Joseph Green at Brothers in Arms. I think he uses NRA curriculum, and he teaches on a more routine basis than I.

If a group of people want to schedule something for a weekday class with a minimum of 6 participants, I would love to talk to you about doing the class. With my weekends being so full of matches I hate to take more time away from my family than I am now. With all that said, don't put it off longer. If you are going to carry, get trained and get on the range and practice. The worst thing you can do is procrastinate and find yourself in a self-defense situation and not know what to do.
